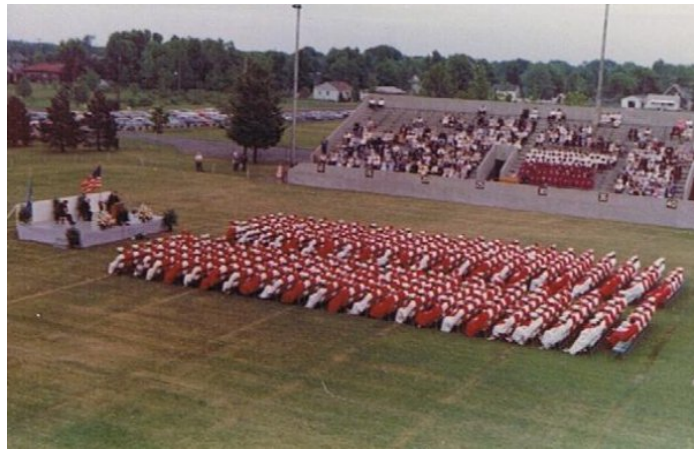

One evening a young boy was looking at Grandma's photo album and they came across this picture of her Baccalaureate. He asked his grandmother, who graduated from PHHS in 1963, about school.

The Grandma replied, "Well, let me think a minute, we were all born the year the Second World War ended. I guess first of all, the girls all had to wear dresses or skirts and your grandfather couldn't wear blue jeans in school. He had to wear dress pants with the shirt tucked in. No one wore clothes with writing on them. When I was a very little girl in grade school, if we needed something on our legs, we could wear leggings or pants, but they had to hang in our locker during school. Our men teachers all wore shirts and ties and the ladies all wore dresses and nylons. There weren't any pantyhose yet.

Not everyone had a television and those that did had black and white ones. Clothes dryers and frozen foods were new. Xerox, contact lenses, laser beams, Frisbees, pantyhose, dishwashers, air conditioners, the pill and plastic everything had not been invented.

Man hadn't yet walked on the moon, but we listened over the P.A. system to John Glen orbit the earth during our sophomore year. Your grandfather and I got married first, and then lived together. Every family had a father and a mother and most mom's stayed home and took care of the family.

We were before gay rights, computer dating, dual careers, day care centers, and group therapy. The Ten Commandments, good judgment and common sense governed our lives. We were taught to know the difference between right and wrong and to stand up and take responsibility for our actions. Living in this country was a big privilege and we knew your grandfather had to serve in the military for 4 years after High school.

MacDonald was just getting started and there was one across the street from PHHS and you could get a hamburger for 25 cents and a shake and fries for 15 cents each. There were no big Mac's yet and we were all amazed when the sign went up that they had sold one million hamburgers. We could hardly believe it. There were a Burger Chef uptown too, and the Powers restaurant across from the Post Office had girls called 'car hops' that came to take your order and bring it out to the cars. Driving through Powers and to the other end of downtown was a popular thing to do on the weekend. Other things we did on weekends were dancing at the Dome or the Deck, skating at Lakeport, and going to drive in movies where you stay in your car and watch the movie on a huge screen with a speaker hanging on your window.

K-Mart was not far from the school, but most of the stores were still downtown so that is where most people did their shopping. And you could stop at the dime stores like Kresge's for lunch. Diana's across the corner was a special place to eat. If you had more money to spend than Kresge's, then Sperry's was the place to go and there was an actual person who operated the elevator for you. The self operated one was a new novelty.

HiFi was the new electronic thing. We never heard of FM radios, tape decks, CDs, yogurt, or guys wearing earrings. Electric Typewriters were new and we only had a few in typing class. We listened to Elvis and watched American Bandstand. The Beatles were just new. Our records were 45's and our albums were 33's. Communicable diseases were things like chicken pox and colds.

In my day, "grass" was mowed, "coke" was a cold drink, "pot" was something your mother cooked in and "rock music" was your grandmothers lullaby. "Aids" were helpers in the Principal's office, "chip" meant a piece of wood, "hardware" was found in a hardware store and "software" wasn't even a word. We did have computers at PHHS to take attendance, but the punch cards the teachers sent to the office every morning sometimes didn't work and the attendance would be wrong.

So, sweetheart, a lot of things have changed since I was in school and they will change for you too. You will have a lot of your own exciting adventures and make lots of friends and probably a few enemies, learn a lot about yourself and other and grow up in many new ways. I just hope you treasure the memories and enjoy people you meet along the way so that when you get 45 years past high school, you will still have pleasant memories and good friends like I do

Does anyone remember if we named this guy?

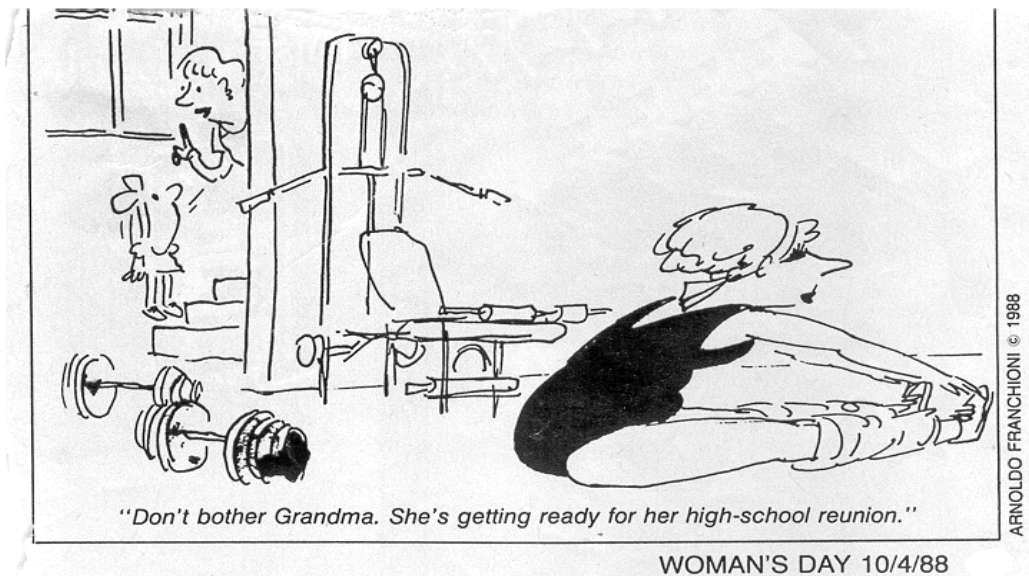
If we didn't, should we?

"When did you graduate?" I asked.

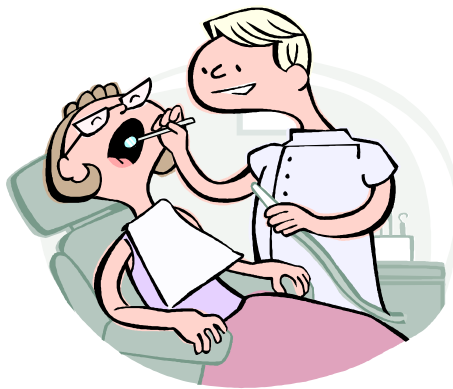
"In 1963" he replied, "Why do you ask?"
